Our Special Unit now provides education and care for 48 children with challenges. Our latest is Matthias. He joined us in January and together with all the other children, were taken to the supermarket for a shopping spree. Each child was given a new pair of shoes, a school bag, underwear and other personal items, as well as a

mattress and a blanket.

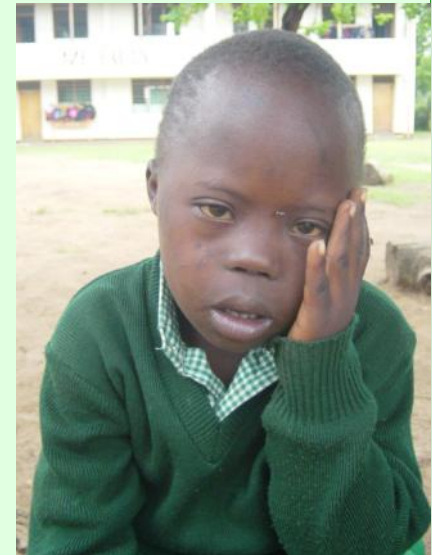
It was all eyes on down the main street of town as the bus dropped off and picked up the children and the goodies.

This month we delivered the last of our consignment of bibles to the prisons. Now we will embark on building a two room Bible school at the near by maximum prison to host the AFCM Bible school.

This has been a tremen-

dous outreach tool and has gone a long way in aiding in the rehabilitation programme in the prison. DOM is represented on the discharge and parole board in the maximum prison and it is another way the light of the Word is reaching the hearts of inmates.

*The school will be able to cater for 120 high school students in the future, starting with Form 1 in 2011.*

With the chief of the area and representatives from Round Table Germany, it was a day of joy to see the 100 children transfer from their one room rental premises to their new two

story building.

Having purchased the adjoining piece of land earlier this year, we will build 4 primary classes for them to continue with their education in 2011.

## New Constitution

As a result of the post election violence experienced in January 2008, the international community has put pressure on Kenya to review our Constitution and to bring reforms in various sectors. A new constitution draft is now being reviewed for submission of debate to Parliament and amendments to be made before a referendum by the people.

Some of these changes include:

1. Pure Presidential system - The president will be Head of state and head of Government.

4. Change of structure of Government to a National Government and County Government.
