Conducting support group training for HIV positive clients

We are pleased to state that we have seen a decline in HIV infection in our area. (These results are due to sensitization that has been carried out by our Home Based Care team and other medical staff through our dispensary). Currently, we are training 165 of our HIV

positive clients in creating support groups amongst themselves so as to offer support for each other in their times of need; including the establishment of income generating activities to help meet the needs of their families.

C urrent projects...

This past week, we loaded a 10 tonne truck with 20 tonne of building material, took it across Lake Victoria on a ferry, drove it through the rough terrain in torrential rain up a mountain range, dropped it at a nearby

school and hired 10 donkeys with 20 church members to carry 100 bags of cement and 40 tonne of sand together with the timber, roofing sheets, doors and windows up the side of a mountain to our Ungoe Branch church!!!



We are building a permanent church there (after 15 years of a mud one)!

Reaching out to the community

Our area village comprises of approximately 19,000 people and we are the only fully functional health facility in the area.

As such, we have many opportunities to reach out to the community through our health care services, including the recent

immunization campaign in which we immunized over 800 children below the age of 5 against the current measles outbreak.

In the past three months, thanks to your support, we have tested over 400 people for HIV, offered home care to 175 HIV positive cli-

ents, reached 3800 prisoners with the gospel, visited and prayed for 380 people in hospital, reached out to over 700 youth and supported 151 orphan children with their basic needs.

Next week we shall be conducting a free dental camp to the entire

population (first come first served) and through every opportunity, our staff are equipped to minister the love of God. This is true religion! *'Bringing Glory to God in bearing much fruit'.*

“Market place ministry”

Last month we started a lunch hour meeting. **“Church in the market place”**

We pitched a tent on an open field opposite the open air market. We set up the sound system and instruments and give glory to God

with singing and ministry of the Word for 1 1/2 hours (5 days a week), as we stood believing for the right premises to become available.

We have seen many saved and healed

through this lunch hour meeting and this month we secured a shop front in the market place for a permanent set up.

It is about taking the gospel to the people.

Children's Church...

Our children's church have a church of their own. With over 250 children attending **each Sunday, it's a blast!** Visitors such as **“Cockey” from Australia, “Bart” the puppet from Italy and his friend “Onjoki” from**

the remote parts of Kenya all take turns in sharing the gospel.

Last week we saw 33 more children saved and 17 water baptized with another 16 on the list for water baptism next week!

That's making disciples!! There's nothing like hearing African children sing and they love to worship the Lord with the beat of an African drum, singing melodies in their heart to the King of Kings.





Feature Story: Help to the helpless

Gloria was born severely physically challenged with two perfectly formed feet at the end of a knee joint. To walk she waddled like a duck.

She joined our school in 2006. After a short

time in our special unit, she was transferred into our main stream schooling. Despite her disability, she had no inability!

Earlier this year she began to experience severe back and muscular pain as her torso was growing at a normal rate but her stumps and feet were struggling to bear the weight. Thanks

to a good Samaritan, Gloria underwent an operation, amputating **both of her "legs"** revealing small stumps that took months to heal and confinement to a wheel chair.

Today, she has received prosthetic legs and is learning to walk (for the first time).

It is a task to balance your body weight when you have never felt it

before but through her determination and our prayer, we expect a speedy and full recovery and her to walk like any other child.
